2	issues we have to resolve and some movements we've
3	got to take. This is the first meeting of the new
4	year. We've got a new commissioner. May I
5	introduce Philip T. O'Hara. Phil comes to us with a
6	superb résumé, a great background in horse racing.
7	He's a graduate of the University of Arizona
8	Racetrack Industry Program. He's worked at Tampa,
9	Arapahoe, Penn National and everything in between, I
10	think.
11	Welcome, Mr. O'Hara.
12	MR. O'HARA: Thank you.
13	MR. HETTEL: Also, the former chairman was not
14	reappointed, so we'll need to appoint a chairman
15	this morning and have an election. May I seek a
16	nomination for the chair of the Virginia Racing
17	Commission?
18	MR. O'HARA: I move to nominate Sarge.
19	MR. HETTEL: May we have a second?
20	MS. DAWSON: Second.
21	MR. HETTEL: All in favor?
22	NOTE: The Commission votes aye.
23	MR. HETTEL: Mr. Chairman, take over.
24	MR. PETRAMALO: Congratulations.
25	MR. REYNOLDS: I don't know what I've gotten

myself in to. 1 2 MR. HETTEL: Let's pick a vice chairman. MR. REYNOLDS: Hey, D.G., I didn't hear your 3 4 affirmative vote. 5 MR. VAN CLIEF: You have my affirmative vote. 6 MR. REYNOLDS: I was just playing. Thank you. 7 Thank you all very much, and let's go ahead and elect a vice chairman. I'll seek a nomination for 8 vice chair. 9 MR. TROUT: Mr. Chairman, as someone here who 10 11 can't defend himself very well, I would nominate Mr. D.G. Van Clief for vice chairman. 12 MR. REYNOLDS: Do I hear a second? 13 14 MR. O'HARA: I'll second. 15 MR. REYNOLDS: Without any further comment, all 16 those in favor say aye. 17 NOTE: The Commission votes aye. 18 MR. REYNOLDS: All right. 19 MR. HETTEL: We still have two appeal hearings 20 this morning, and with the weather forecast, I think 21 it would probably be necessary to go ahead and hear 22 that portion of our agenda today and then we can, 23 depending on the longevity of both these hearings, 24 we can either take up the regular business of the 25 Commission, or we can adjourn and remeet next week

1	or at a time convenient to the membership.
2	MR. REYNOLDS: I think that's a good plan.
3	NOTE: Other matters not on this record
4	are heard; thereafter, the monthly meeting
5	continues as follows:
6	MR. LAWS: Mr. Chairman, you have the floor.
7	MR. REYNOLDS: I forgot we were probably gonna
8	try to get a stay of that hearing, but that's off
9	the table now, so I talked to each of the
10	stakeholders individually about postponing this
11	meeting so everybody can get on home.
12	Do you all think you want to try to grind
13	through this meeting now or get on home? Those of
14	you who live the farthest away have the loudest
15	voice. Frank?
16	MR. PETRAMALO: I wouldn't object to going home
17	at this point.
18	MR. REYNOLDS: I've talked to all of the
19	stakeholders and they agree with that, so we will
20	adjourn in just a second.
21	Mr. Hettel, do you have anything you want to
22	say or do you want to e-mail and get a date? Maybe
23	we can go next month, but push it up and make it
24	sooner rather than later.
25	MR. HETTEL: The availability of the commission

members is the paramount thing. 1 2 Right. MR. REYNOLDS: MR. HETTEL: If we could do that right now, 3 4 let's go ahead and establish a good time next week 5 or the first week of February for the next Racing 6 Commission meeting and we'll send out proper notice. 7 MR. REYNOLDS: The appeal hearing will be at a different meeting, possibly? 8 9 MS. DAWSON: Separate meeting. 10 DR. HARDEN: Which week? 11 MR. HETTEL: The first week of February. 12 MR. PETRAMALO: You're thinking of something 13 next week? 14 MR. HETTEL: Commissioners, what's your 15 pleasure? What's your availability? It's up to you 16 all, not anybody else. 17 MR. O'HARA: No. ma'am. I'm not available. 18 The first week of February works for me. 19 MR. REYNOLDS: How about February 4th or 5th? 20 MR. TROUT: What day of the week is that? 21 MR. REYNOLDS: The 4th is a Tuesday. The 5th 22 is a Wednesday. 23 MR. TROUT: Either one. 24 MR. REYNOLDS: IS D.G. on the phone? 25 MR. HETTEL: D.G.?

1	MS. NIXON: Nothing yet.
2	MR. HETTEL: Let me call him real quick.
3	MR. REYNOLDS: Carol, are you good?
4	MS. DAWSON: The 4th or 5th is good for me.
5	Either one.
6	MR. REYNOLDS: Let's shoot for the 5th for now.
7	MR. HETTEL: D.G., we're shooting for the next
8	Racing Committee day. What is it, Sarge, the 5th?
9	MR. REYNOLDS: I'm shooting for the 5th.
10	MR. HETTEL: How is February 5th for you?
11	MR. PETRAMALO: I'm gonna be out of the country
12	from February 2nd through the 20th.
13	MR. REYNOLDS: Okay.
14	MR. HETTEL: D.G.'s not available.
15	MR. LAWS: Can you call in? Apparently, nobody
16	can.
17	MR. TROUT: Can we do it a week earlier?
18	MR. PETRAMALO: Unfortunately, no. I'm told
19	the phone service is not very good where I'm going.
20	MR. REYNOLDS: Frank is out until the 20th.
21	Well, we can put it off can you all have a stay
22	of execution on shutting down the OTBs until that
23	long? Can you do the 4th?
24	MR. PETRAMALO: No. The 2nd.
25	MR. O'HARA: Is there any date available this

week? 1 MR. LAWS: I'm guessing all the offices are 2 going to be closed tomorrow. 3 MR. PETRAMALO: Anytime Tuesday, Wednesday, 4 5 Thursday or Friday of next week is good. 6 MR. REYNOLDS: How do you all look the 28th of 7 January? 8 MR. TROUT: What day? 9 MS. DAWSON: Tuesday. 10 MR. TROUT: The 28th, that'll do. 11 MR. REYNOLDS: Want to do it Friday the 30th? 12 what about the week of the 27th? 13 MR. PETRAMALO: Any day except Monday. I'll be 14 in the hospital. 15 MR. REYNOLDS: We'll come and see you. REYNOLDS: Do I hear a second? 25 MR. HETTEL: Second.
